UNIVERSITY POLICIES

Salisbury University minors require:

- The completion of at least 18 credits with grades of C or better.
- At least 15 credits applied toward the minor must be coursework that is not used to satisfy General Education requirements.
- At least nine credits must be earned at SU.

Advisement for the minor is available from the Teacher Education or Education Specialties department.

- Complete courses with grades of C or better.
- Courses for the minor will be determined by the student's major (see below).
