- Earn college credit while still in high school!

- Transfer the credits you've earned to any other university.
- Learn the time-management skills, study skills and discipline you'll need to succeed in college.

- Free up time in college for you to study abroad or double major.
- Graduate from college early, saving you money and giving you a jump start on your career.





What are the dual enrollment eligibility requirements?

- Full-time junior or senior standing at a Somerset County public high school
- Have an overall unweighted grade point average of at least 2.75
- Prerequisite coursework may be required for some courses

How much does dual enrollment cost?

- All tuition costs and required course materials are absolutely free to students, for 1 or 2 courses per regular semester.
- Students may receive permission from their school principal to take up to 4 courses per semester at no cost. Any additional courses, including summer and winter courses, may be taken at regular in-state tuition rates.

How do I apply and register?

What classes should I take?

The choice of courses is completely up to you (and your guidance counselor)! But, since you will be headed to college soon, we have suggestions!

All universities have common course requirements that every student must take. At a minimum, most require students to complete courses in English composition, mathematics, lab science and two semesters of a foreign language. The dual enrollment courses approved by Somerset County are optimized to help students accomplish these requirements early.
