Why should I consider dual enrollment?

- Earn college credit while earning high school credit!
- Save money! The tuition required to earn Salisbury University credit is paid for by WCPS.
- Level 4, weighted courses look great on your transcript.
- Courses are taught by WCPS teachers who ensure you have the proper support and guidance through your first college experience.
- Transfer the credits you've earned to any other university.
- Learn the time-management skills, study skills and discipline you'll need to succeed in college.
- Improve your chance of qualifying for scholarships or awards.
- Free up enough time in college for you to take part in programs like study abroad or to double major.
- Graduate from college on time or early, which will save you money.





What is the difference between dual enrollment and concurrent enrollment in Worcester County Public Schools?

- Dual Enrollment is when a student enrolled in a public high school takes a college course on a high school campus in Worcester County. The course is taught by a high school teacher who holds the credentials that Salisbury University requires of their adjunct professors.
- Concurrent Enrollment is when a student enrolled in a public high school in Worcester County enrolls in a college course on a community college or university campus.

If I take a dual enrollment course, will it appear on my high school transcript that is sent to colleges?

Yes, the course title, grade and high school credit awarded will be recorded. This course is a level 4, weighted course and will be considered into your high school GPA.

What grade do I have to earn in a dual enrollment course to receive credit from Salisbury University?

The grade you earn in the dual enrollment course will be recorded as your grade in the college equivalent. Therefore, credit can be earned with any grade other than an E/F.

How do I enroll in a dual enrollment course?

Contact Ms. Hensley in the WTHS Guidance Office for information on eligibility requirements and necessary forms, which includes:

- WCPS's Dual Enrollment Certification Form (signed by school dual enrollment contact)
- SU's High School Students Application for Concurrent Enrollment Form
- Non-Degree Registration Form
- Maryland Residency Form

Still not sure whether dual enrollment would benefit you?

If you take any of the courses / course sequences listed in this brochure, you will receive the exact same instruction as those students earning college credit. There is also no requirement that you share the results of your dual enrollment experience with any college you may attend. College credits are generally valid for seven or more years after you earn them at most colleges. So given that WCPS is paying the entire tuition cost for these college credits, there is simply no reason to not sign up for dual enrollment!
