

The first semester at Salisbury can be very different than high school and, sometimes, even other colleges. An initial drop in performance is not uncommon even for the most accomplished students. Your student may find that their study skills need to be improved to rise to the challenges they encounter in their first semester. Fortunately, there are plenty of resources to help your student find success academically. You can support this rough patch by encouraging your student to utilize such resources as:

• The Guerrieri Academic Commons offers many cozy spaces to study, books to be

checked out and a friendly staff to help your student with all their research needs.

- The Center for Student Achievement offers an array of programs to help your student maximize their academic achievement.
- The Academic Advising Center is there to assist your student by helping create a map to graduation.

Additionally, students can meet with their professors by setting up a meeting or attending the professor's office hours. Please encourage your student to utilize these resources proactively, rather than waiting until the last week of the semester. The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, also known as FERPA or the Buckley Amendment, protects the privacy of student educational records and controls access to them. Under FERPA, students have the right to:

- Annual notification of their privacy rights
- Inspect and review their education records
- Request an amendment to their educational records where appropriate to ensure accuracy
- Limit disclosure of their education records without prior written consent, with the exception of directory information allowed by FERPA
- File a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the University to comply with the requirements of FERPA

Student Health Services




City of Salisbury



Known as "Maryland's Coastal College Town," the city of Salisbury has long been the crossroads of the historic Delmarva Peninsula. With a population of over 32,000, it's the largest city on the Eastern Shore and one of the fastest growing cities in Maryland, according to city officials. Founded in 1732 and incorporated in 1854, it also is the county seat for Wicomico. The area offers the ideal mix of an urban center, nestled within a scenic rural region, centrally located to major metropolitan areas.

Located just two miles from campus, Downtown Salisbury is a designated Main Street Maryland community, with shops, restaurants and events. You can get downtown via bike, car or even kayak! A trolley service runs between SU and downtown during the semester.
