

   Check out the amazing work occurring in the realm of research and creative activity across campus, as well as the Q&A with <u>Provost Couch</u> which focuses on her area of research.
- Last week, CHHS and Fulton hosted Director Usherla DeBerry and staff from the Governor's Office for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. They met with President Lepre, School Directors/Chairs from the School of Social Work and Department of Modern Languages, Deans from CHHS and Fulton, and representatives from the Disability Resource Center, the Office of Diversity and Inclusion, and the Office of Institutional Equity. The visit included lunch with deaf studies minor students, a campus tour, and meetings with Eastern Shore community representatives who provide services to the deaf community or teach deaf culture and/or ASL classes. The purpose was to learn more about SU's outstanding deaf studies minor and resources available for the deaf and hard of hearing on campus and in the community.
- SU is headed for the stars with a new <u>Space Act Agreement signed between SU and NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center</u>. This partnership promises enhanced experiential learning at NASA's Wallops Flight Facility in Wallops Island, VA, and aims to bolster NASA involvement on campus, potentially including guest speakers and participation in campus events like job and career fairs.

The new system will help modernize library services and functions, provide more search options and an enhanced interface, and increase cooperation with other systems across campus and with other academic institutions across the state. For instructors, there are two key considerations:
  - Existing links to the library's catalog will no longer work. For courses beginning
    in Summer 2024, we ask that you identify links in MyClasses or other course
    materials that will need to be updated after the migration is complete. Links that
    need to be updated start with <u>salisbury.on.worldcat.org/</u> or
    salisbury.worldcat.org/
  - No former version of the catalog will be available after our migration. The discovery search on our library homepage will be the only search option to locate library books, ebooks, DVDs, and other materials.
