These constructions have also been used to delineate accepted rules of responsibility for violence and abuse, and to support and justify claims to unequal power and privilege. Several gender-based assumptions have served to create gender dichotomies when it comes to such subjects as war and peace, heroism, patriotism, innocence and vulnerability. Gendered images of war and violence have not only privileged men and boys as warriors, but they have also
