Naming of 2015-2016 Chair

Darrell Mullins was named the 2015-2016 Chair, per the revised bylaws which state that the Faculty Senate representative will chair the Coordinating Committee in even fiscal years.

Report from Faculty Senate – Darrell Mullins

- General Education Steering Committee
 - Held open forums for faculty; sent survey to students and alumni.
 - Faculty Senate voted to meet one extra time per month exclusively for the discussion of General Education Review.
- Evaluation of Administrators
 - Faculty will evaluate department chair, dean, Provost, and President through an online survey.
 - Anonymous aggregate results go to the person evaluated and their supervisor.
 - Evaluations should be completed in November.

Report from Adjunct Faculty Caucus – Tim Robinson

- Looking at the compensation for adjuncts. Part-time faculty are paid more than adjunct faculty. Job descriptions are very similar. Advising is one aspect of part-time faculty's job description but not adjunct's job description.
- He spoke in front of the Chancellor last week regarding this subject.
- They try to assemble once a year. Also, the Provost speaks with the adjuncts once or twice a year.
- Seidel is currently the only school that has had more than one person interested in serving on the Adjunct Caucus.

Report from Staff Senate – Brian Waller

- They are filling the ranks. Last year there were many vacancies. Now, all senate positions and committee positions are filled.
- No significant issues at this time.
- Working on finding nominations for the Regent's Staff award. Lisa Gray has discussed this process with Amy Hasson.

Report from Student Government Association – Tyler Gibson

- He is doing a structural reorganization of the SGA. Currently, he oversees 10 people, and the 30 senators report to one officer who then reports to him. There were no real

committees. Now there are committees that function and he is requiring each committee to have goals.

- They are looking at how they handle large events, such as Homecoming. The SGA will give some of the Homecoming events to the other Big 6 organizations.

Report from Graduate Student Council – Carrienne Cicero

- The main goal is getting more representation from the graduate programs. The bylaws designate two representatives from each graduate degree program will make up the Assembly.
- Recently voted to change the bylaws to include two graduate assistant representatives, plus a representative from each of the four schools.
- Working with the Alumni Association this year on Homecoming events.
- Topic for the Brown Bag Lunch series this year is how to survive graduate school.

Bylaw Review and Revision / Committees

- All governance bodies except the SGA approved the bylaw revisions last spring. Tyler said that the SGA has now approved the bylaw revisions.
- The word “DRAFT” will be removed from the bylaws document and the final version will be posted on the Campus Governance web page.
- Please review the committee listing and fill necessary positions.
